

In-Person Class Protocols Spring 2021

We are excited to begin offering some in-person classes again this winter! It is important that everyone follow these protocols to take care of each other and make sure this in person activity remains possible. ****Subject to change based on current regulations at time of classes.**

Students **are not allowed to come to class*** if:

- a) They have been diagnosed with COVID-19 and are still within the 14 day quarantine period
- b) They have been in contact with someone known to have COVID-19 (within the last 14 days)
- c) They have had symptoms of COVID-19 (within the previous 24 hrs)

*In the event of the above, students will have access to view the class virtually and participate from home if they desire.

Protocols:

- Students will enter and exit each classroom from specified doors only, utilizing church hallway doors only to access their classroom's designated restroom. Watch for specific information for your child's classroom.
- Teachers or TAs will take and record student temperatures outside each exterior classroom door prior to students entering the building. Students must have a temperature of lower than 100.4 to be admitted, per CDC guidelines.
- Masks will be worn by everyone before, after and during class.
- 6 ft social distancing shall be maintained at all times, including while dancing. Tape or other markers shall be used in dance classes to make sure this happens.
- Only one student at a time will be allowed in a restroom.
- Restroom cleanliness will be monitored by Resident Parent and Class Coordinator in addition to church janitorial staff.

- Students should bring a full water bottle (no use of drinking fountains) and their own towel if needed.
- There will be no group break time. Students will stay in their classrooms and have a (still socially distanced) break with their classmates.
- If at any point a student or teacher receives a confirmed COVID-19 diagnosis, they should let the class coordinator know immediately.
- All parents would be notified of the possible exposure, while maintaining as much confidentiality as possible.
- Class will be moved to a virtual format if necessary in the event of an outbreak or other unforeseen scenario.
